

ARANDORA *STAR*

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When Italy entered the war in the summer of 1940, Italians living in Wales and the rest of the UK were branded as enemy aliens.

On the 1st of July 1940, The Arandora Star, mistaken for a troop ship, is torpedoed by a German U-boat off the coast of Ireland, and sunk with 446 Italian men's lives lost.

Our play, The Arandora Star, tells the emotional story of Lina as she struggles to cope with the loss of her father, Guido and how she and her mother, Carmella survive in a time of war and prejudice.

The Arandora Star is a true story and will explore the life of Italians living and working in Wales during World War 2 and follows Lina's quest for her father and the truth.

This play highlights the issues of immigration and integration.

What you need to do

Visit www.theatr-nanog.co.uk/arandora-star to submit your booking request.
Book your free ticket to the Teacher Preview evening. arandorastar.eventbrite.co.uk
We then email you a contract with your allocated date for you to sign and return. It's very quick to do, type your name and click send so please do this within 7 days of receipt.
Download our app, full of resources for you and your pupils including lessons plans for the term. We'll send you full instructions when you've signed your contract.
Arrange your transport.
Familiarise yourself with your schedule for the day and arrange how your group will split, if required. (Although the theatre can hold 100 people, the rooms for the workshops can only hold a maximum of 45 pupils each, so depending on the size of your group and how many people are coming that day we may need to split you into two groups to fit everyone in. We'll let you know before you arrive if this is necessary)
Make a note in your diary to return your completed feedback form to us within 10 days of your visit.
Pay the invoice that we will send to you, within 60 days of your visit.

How much does it cost?

We receive funding from Arts Council Wales and a number of Trusts and Foundations towards this project.

We will use this funding to reduce the cost to you, reducing it to £7.50+VAT per pupil / adult plus one free adult ticket with every 10 pupils.

As a condition of this funding we need to collect feedback from every participant of this project.

To receive this reduced cost, we ask for three things in return:

1. You sign your booking contract which will be emailed to you within 7 days of receipt.

2. Complete a simple online survey within 10 days following your visit.

3. Pay your invoice within 60 days after your visit.

You will be sent reminders so don't worry about forgetting. Any schools not adhering to these conditions will be charged the full cost of £12.50+VAT per person.
